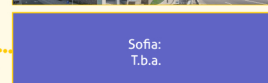
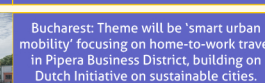


Budapest, 14th April: Opening Exhibition 'How design transforms urban mobility' Professional Platform on urban cycling

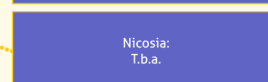

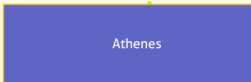
